# Southern California Collegiate Ski and Snowboard Conference Constitution

## **Article 1**

### Purpose

Foster Amateur collegiate ski and snowboard competitions, for the universities and colleges encompassed within the jurisdiction, as specified by the United States Ski and Snowboard Association<sup>1</sup>.

## **Article 2**

### Organization

- A. The association shall be governed by an Assembly and an Executive Committee.
- B. An action taken in the name of the Conference must have the expressed or implied approval of the Assembly and of the Executive Committee.
- C. Decisions of the Assembly shall, in all cases, be considered binding upon the members of the Conference and upon the Executive Committee.

## **Article 3**

### Assembly

- A. The Assembly shall be composed of one voting representative from each member organization. Selection of said member shall be the responsibility of the represented member organization.
- B. Power and duties reserved to the Assembly include, but are not limited to: approval of the expenditures, election of the President, admittance of new members, censure of regular members, expulsion of regular members, approval of any agreement made by the Executive Committee with outside agents, amendments of the by-laws and amendments of this Constitution.
- C. The Assembly shall meet at least twice during the regular season, herein considered to be from September to August of the following year. At least one meeting will be held by May of the following year.
- D. Notification of any Assembly meeting must be given to its representatives in writing by the President not less than two weeks in advance of said meeting.
- E. The President shall set the date and preside over all meetings of the Assembly. In the event of the President's absence, the Vice President shall preside over all the meetings of the Assembly. The Assembly shall choose a suitable substitute from among the Executive Committee or Assembly members if neither the President nor Vice President are present.
- F. The President may call extraordinary meetings of the Assembly if deemed necessary.
- G. The President has the authority to suspend a member of the Executive Committee if circumstances warrant this action.
- H. The President will assign the Executive Committee duties on the hill each day.
- I. An extraordinary meeting of the Assembly must be called as soon as possible if a majority of the member organizations so demand.

- J. A majority vote of a quorum (two-thirds of the entire membership of the assembly) is required to pass all issues before the Assembly, with the exception of the expulsion or censure of the President, and amendments to this Constitution. In these cases, majority vote of the entire Assembly is required.
- K. Any issue requiring the vote of the entire Assembly may be voted on by a suitable proxy, validity of which shall be determined by the President, in the event that the regular representative is not in attendance at said meeting.
- L. Expulsion or censure of a member organization and election or dismissal of the President shall be decided by a secret ballot. All other issues shall be decided by a roll call voice vote. Any vote may be decided by secret ballot, if a majority of the Assembly deems it necessary.

## **Article 4**

### **Executive Committee**

The Executive Committee shall be composed of a President, Vice President, Treasurer, Technical Delegate(s), Marketing Director, and Statistician.

#### **President**

Chief Executive Officer for the SCCSC, board of directors representative to the USCSA, appoints other members of the Executive Committee, schedules race dates with ski areas, serves on jury committee as Chief Gatekeeper (see USCSA Handbook), and is on the hill during all races to supervise and coordinate the event. The President will notify the Assembly at least one week in advance, if possible, of all changes of race related activities. *The President shall serve a ~~two~~ one (21) year term in office.*<sup>23</sup>

#### **Technical Delegate**

The Technical Delegate (TD) is the single race official with the greatest responsibility for the proper and safe conduct of the event. The role of the TD is multi-faceted. The TD is a positive contributor to a race through his/her wide knowledge and experience; is a counselor to the race organizers, is charged with ultimate supervision of the event, and is expected to make decisions with regard to the safety aspects and nature of the rules as they apply to their application. In addition, the objective of the TD is to help the organizers run the best possible competition even under the worst possible conditions. Success of this goal will call for foresight, preparation, organization, and anticipation on the part of the TD. The position may be split into two areas of responsibility, Alpine and Snowboard / Freestyle.

#### **Vice President**

Responsible for recording team supplied Academic Verification forms of all SCCSC racers. "Checks-in" racers during registration to be sure that all racers are registered, academically eligible, and team dues paid-up, before allowing them to race in each day's events. Assigns bib numbers and makes sure they are recorded accurately. Attends, records, and disburses minutes from all SCCSC meetings. Assists the Statistician with race registration and team seeding activities and assists the Marketing Director with media communications. Performs such duties and exercises authority from time to time as delegated or assigned to him or her by the President. (Files USSA Alpine schedule agreements when required.) This position may be combined with other positions on the SCCSC Executive Board if required. These duties may be performed by the TD or a delegated assistant to the TD of each sport.

### **Treasurer**

Chief Financial Officer for the SCCSC, is responsible for the collection and disbursement of funds, and providing financial reports to the Assembly during meetings. The Treasurer sets and maintains the annual league budget in conjunction with the President. Assigns fees, collects fines, and reports team status to the President. Provides monthly financial reports to each of the member organizations and the Executive Committee. This position may be combined with other positions on the Executive Board, except for President, if required.

### **Marketing Director**

Develops the marketing strategy for the SCCSC, including working towards an increased awareness of the SCCSC in the community and in Southern California both on campuses that compete in the SCCSC and outside of the campus life. Responsible for developing an effective plan of securing equipment sponsors in the form of pro-deals and working towards securing corporate donors/sponsors. Develops an effective media correspondence with corporations and the public. Performs additional duties as requested by the President. Co-responsible for creating, developing and maintaining the SCCSC Web Site. This position may be combined with other positions on the SCCSC Executive Board if required.

### **Information Systems Director/Statistician**

Compiles and disperses race results including posting race results to the web site as needed. During racer registration, responsible for all seeding forms and verifying racer status; including, registration fees, academic eligibility, and individual liability release. These check sheets are to be kept current and brought to each race. Responsible for posting all current race results prior to each morning's registration. Assists the Vice President at race registration with all race data files, official times, protests, team registration forms, hand times, DQ lists, and evaluation sheets. These files are to be made available at each race for review of protests. Keeps and maintains computer hardware and files. Co-responsible for creating, developing and maintaining the SCCSC Web Site. This position may be combined with other positions on the SCCSC Executive Board if required.

- A. The President shall be elected at the Spring Assembly for a term of ~~one~~ *two* years<sup>4</sup>. A majority vote of the entire Assembly is required for election. The Assembly shall hold a second election between the two highest vote-receiving candidates in the event that a majority is not attainable by any one candidate.
  - A.1 *The current reigning Overall Male & Female Team Champion, defined as the Trophy holder in Section 21.C, is to be granted an additional vote in the case of a tie in a Presidential Election. All Proxy Rights afforded to a voting Team, defined in Article 3.K, are applicable herein.*<sup>5</sup>
- B. The President shall decide all tie votes in the Assembly, with the exception of the Presidential election.
- C. The President shall appoint all members of the Executive Committee, whose term in office shall coincide with that of the President.
- D. The Executive Committee shall: Oversee all races, set up the race schedule in consultation with the Assembly, oversee all expenditures and provide for the general operation and continuation of the corporation.
- E. If for any reason the President is dismissed by the Assembly or resigns, the Assembly shall elect a new President as soon as possible. The Vice President will act in place of the President until a new President is elected.
- F. The members of the Executive Committee shall receive an expense reimbursement per race

attended, determined by Federal Law as follows: Mileage reimbursement as the rate of \$.35/mile, Meals expensed at a rate of \$5 for breakfast, \$10 lunch, and \$15 for dinner or \$30 per diem. Details of the reimbursement policy are outlined in the Executive Board Staff Manual.

## **Article 5**

### **Other Committees**

#### **Race Jury Committee**

Composition of the Jury is found in the USCSA Rule Book sections 3.9 and 3.10. The positions are: Chief of Race, Referee, Chief of Course, and Chief of Timing and Calculations. These positions shall be filled by the race department of the host mountain. Race Secretary will be the league Vice President and the Assistant Referee will be selected by the President.

#### **Alumni Committee**

Organizes and operates the SCCSC Alumni Division. Communicates and distributes information to members of the Alumni league regarding scheduled events, races, etc. Collects fees and provides budget for the Alumni Division. SCCSC General Assembly is not held accountable for financial support of the Alumni League, but may offer such support upon approval of the Assembly. Also responsible for the continued effort to acquire donation support through Alumni contributions.

## **Article 6**

### **Membership**

- A. Any legitimate skiing **or snowboarding** organization representing a College or University in the Central and Southern California, Arizona, or **southern** Nevada area that offers a minimum of an Associate or Bachelors Degree is eligible for regular membership in the Conference. Any such organization desiring membership in the Conference must demonstrate to the Conference its ability to provide required financial support of the Conference and reasonable attendance at Conference functions including Assemblyies meetings and races. **Membership in the Conference requires registration in and good standing with the United States Collegiate Ski and Snowboard Association, under which the Conference operates.**<sup>6</sup>
- B. Regular membership fees are to be set annually by the Assembly and payable according to terms in this guide. An annual budget is to be presented at the fall meeting and approved by the Assembly.
- C. Member organizations shall: exhibit reasonable attendance at Conference functions, assume all duties and responsibilities delegated to them by the Executive Committee and conduct themselves in a manner suitable to the efficient operation of the Conference.
- D. If for any reason a member organization conducts itself in a degrading manner or violates the laws of the Conference, the Assembly may censure said member. The penalty incurred by the censure shall be a fine of not less than \$50.00 and suspension of membership privileges for not less than two races.
- E. If for any reason a member organization exhibits conduct to the Conference and whose laws state that that organization's presence in the Conference is no longer warranted, the Assembly may expel said member from the Conference and prohibit said member's participation in any Conference activities without the refund of any Conference fees. Any member expelled shall be considered a candidate for new membership for the following year, and must meet all

requirements for new membership.

## BY-LAWS OF THE SCCSC

### Section 1

#### Regulations Governing Races

- A. Standard USCSA rules shall govern in all areas not specifically covered in this rule book. The Assembly shall make any amendments in said rules if deemed necessary for the proper organization and implementation of Conference races. At those races held in conjunction with the USSA, all rules of that organization shall be applicable, and in no way may the Assembly or the Executive Committee act in a way to undermine them. All racers must qualify for SCCSC membership. Team Captains and Coaches are responsible for informing their respective teams of F.I.S., USSA, USCSA, USASA, and SCCSC rules.
- B. All races shall consist of two runs unless overruled by the Race Jury Committee (see Article 5 of the SCCSC Constitution).

### Section 2

#### Teams and Classifications of Competitors

- A. Each member organization is permitted to enter no more than one men's snowboard team and ski team and one women's snowboard team and ski team in any race.
- B. Each of these said teams may contain no more than five competitors of the same sex and a combined total of ten competitors for both male and female teams, in any one "A" race. Only the times of racers seeded in the first five positions shall constitute the "A" team as it applies to team scoring and competition in the USCSA Rule Book section 6.
- C. Each member organization is entitled to race as many "B" team members as it desires. These racers will receive "B" team points, and will not compete against "A" team racers in a race where they have been designated "B" team.

### Section 3

#### Member Organizations

- A. All individual fees will be set annually by the Assembly and charged to all member organizations. It is the responsibility of the member organization to pay all individual's racing fees. A racer shall not be allowed to participate in any given race if the Executive Committee does not have a record of the fees being paid.
- B. All member organizations of the Conference shall hold the Conference and the mountain harmless in the event of any injuries suffered at a Conference race. The Executive Committee shall prepare a form that every racer must sign in addition to payment of their membership fee, stating the racer's willingness to release liability from the Conference and the mountain of any injury suffered throughout the year.
- C. All member organizations will be held financially responsible for any damage caused to Conference property while in the possession of said organization.
- D. All member organizations of the conference, in order to participate in any USCSA conference (all SCCSC competitions), regional, or national championship event, must be a member in good standing of the USCSA national organization. All fees must be paid to the USCSA before being permitted to compete in SCCSC competition. All rules, regulations and policies of the national

organization must be adhered to by teams vying for the opportunity to race in such championship events. (Per section 2.1 A of the USCSA Rule Book.)

## **Section 4**

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- A. Students must qualify under USCSA eligibility requirements outlined in section 2 of the USCSA Rule Book.
- B. Any student not affiliated with a member organization shall be ineligible to race in any Conference races except as permitted under the rules governing guest participants.
- C. A student can become affiliated with a member organization by two methods:
  - i. They can be officially enrolled at the school of said member organization, and be a full time student (with 12 unit average over past 2 semesters or 3 quarters),
  - ii. They can be officially enrolled at a nearby institution which in itself qualifies under the membership qualifications of the SCCSC Constitution (Article 6), but in itself does not have the ability to form a separate team.
- D. If a racer is using affiliation as described in C.ii. above, they must affiliate with their own institution at the time when they have the ability to form a separate member organization within the SCCSC.<sup>7</sup>

## **Section 5**

### **Guest Participants**

- A. Any skiing organization outside the Central or Southern California area desiring to race in any Conference race must present its request to the Executive Committee which shall determine the convenience and feasibility of allowing said organization to participate.
- B. If said organization is allowed to participate, a fee of \$40.00 per racer per day must be paid to the Conference, \$10.00 of which is refundable as deposit for said bib. If said organization races for a complete weekend, then the price of subsequent days is reduced to \$30 per racer per day.
- C. A temporary bib will be assigned to the guest racer. This bib must be returned to the Executive Committee at the end of the race day.
- D. Guest participants shall be ineligible for any season trophies, but will remain eligible for any individual race day awards.

## **Section 6**

### **Race Organization**

- A. Each race will be held under the supervision of the member organization assigned to host the race, and the Executive Committee. These groups shall abide by the rules, duties and regulations set forth in the manual.
- B. The Executive Committee shall oversee all races and be responsible for setting, or having the course set.

- C. The Executive Committee shall assign member organizations those duties necessary for the operation of the race.
- D. All member organizations are responsible for the general upkeep of the courses and are requested to assist the other member organizations whenever possible in the efficient operation of the race.

## **Section 7**

### Team Duties on Race Day

- A. Each race weekend will have one or two different teams hosting the events. The host teams will execute the following duties:
  - Assistant starters
  - Timing shack scorekeeper
  - Scoreboard keeper
  - Photographer
  - Prep Crew / Tear Down Crew
  - Newsletter Article
- B. There will be a meeting at **8:30 a.m. on race days** at the registration table between the host teams and the Executive Staff. The responsibilities of each station will be delegated and explained at this time. A list of the race duties will be handed out and explained to those crew members working the race course. Failure to attend this meeting will result in a fine and/or penalty.
- C. The host teams with the assigned duties will have their members at the start 5 minutes before the start of the race. Each team shall have the three members at the assigned stations no later than 5 minutes before each race run. Failure to do so shall result in fines and/or penalties.
- D. Individual team treasurers are responsible for keeping up with their team's finances. If that team is to fall behind by \$100.00 or more, that team may be denied registration by the Executive committee on the morning of the race.

## **Section 8**

### Coach and Captain Responsibilities

- A. Executive Committee interfaces with racers through the Coaches and Captains.
- B. Coaches and Captains interface with resort race departments through SCCSC Executive Committee. Racers, Team Officers, and Captains should never approach mountain officials with complaints. The proper channels must be followed through the SCCSC Executive Committee.
- C. It is the Coaches and Captains primary responsibility to make certain that all team members are fully knowledgeable of SCCSC rules and regulations and verify individual racers' eligibility to SCCSC Vice President.
- D. Coaches and Captains shall organize their teams for assigned duties. Hosting teams will be held responsible for on-hill duties, described in Section 7.
- E. Familiarize teams with course maintenance techniques and be prepared to organize proper repair at each race.

- F. Organize distribution of all promotional materials. Coordinate all team activities with college representatives.
- G. Submit a complete list of team's racers, verified by each school's Registrar, to the USCSA for academic verification by the start of the first race. Unverified racers shall be ineligible for further participation until verified eligible. Petition for exceptions must be submitted in writing.

## **Section 9**

### **Racer Duties and Responsibilities**

- A. Get to the start area **BEFORE** your number is called.
- B. Understand and accept the inherent risks of the sport. Sign your release forms. Racers will not be permitted to race unless all release forms have been signed.
- C. Display good sportsmanship; know and respect the rules. Show proper courtesy to all race course personnel.
- D. If you encounter problems or difficulties, always consult your Coach or club officer.
- E. You are responsible for your actions on the hill. Always ski or board in control. Use proper course inspection techniques.
- F. Bibs must be worn to compete. Bibs must be FULLY visible, FASTENED in place, and outside all warm-up clothing, from the time the course is set until the course is taken down. Failure to have bibs properly displayed during the race will result in a fine of \$20.
- G. The bib number MUST be the number assigned by the Executive Committee. Racers without proper bibs will be disqualified and will not be able to race that race. No writing of their number onto another racer's bib, this is grounds for disqualification. In the event of a lost bib, racer must go to registration area and purchase a new bib. Once a new bib has been purchased, the old bib will become obsolete.
- H. All racers must wear helmets which are in good physical condition to participate in each event sanctioned by the USCSA and SCCSC.
- I. Assist your team with mandatory hosting duties.
- J. Show proper courtesy to all race course personnel. Interfering with Mountain Personnel, Executive Committee, Gatekeepers, Starters, Finishers, or a racer on course will result in a \$25 fine.
- K. If you miss a gate, you must either hike back up the hill to the gate or ski off the course.
- L. Absolutely NO swearing, profanity, or obscene language will be permitted on the race course at ANY time. Failure to follow this responsibility will result in a \$10 fine for first offense, \$20 fine for second offense, and \$30 fine for third offense. Racer found swearing and assessed a fine may be disqualified for the days events, determined by the SCCSC Chief of Race on a case by case basis.
- M. Absolutely NO drinking of any type of alcoholic beverage will be permitted on the race course at ANY time, including beverages in cans, bottles, or any of type of container.

Failure to follow this responsibility will result in a \$25 fine for first offense, \$50 fine for second offense, and removal from the SCCSC on the third offense. Any student found consuming alcohol in SCCSC attire (bib or other assigned, purchased, or provided trademarked uniform) or with alcohol at an SCCSC event will be disqualified automatically from the days events in addition to the fines mentioned.

- N. Teams running ineligible racers will result in team disqualification from the day's events of the discipline with ineligible racers participating. Ineligible racers includes switching bib numbers for a single race or day's events.
- O. Anyone associated with the SCCSC who tries to defraud the league, the mountain, or any other organization involved with our league will be fined \$100 and will be expelled from the SCCSC, and may be subject to legal liability (both criminal and civil).
- P. Persistent violation of the race rules by an individual racer or team, will result in either temporary or permanent disqualification of said racer or team.
- Q. The SCCSC is an extension of Intercollegiate Athletics and as such demands good sportsmanship from all participants. Racers found not acting as good sports may be disqualified or fined \$20 by SCCSC Race Officials. Racers accused of poor sportsmanship will be requested to explain and defend their actions prior to receiving disciplinary action. Poor sportsmanship includes, but is not limited to, throwing equipment, excessive cussing, disrespecting Race Officials, etc.
- R. No athlete may participate in race events if they have unpaid fines assessed in their or their team's name

## **Section 10**

### **Procedure for Race Day**

- A. Saturday late ADD, CHANGE and DELETE racer registration begins at 7:30 a.m. The Vice President may, at their discretion, open additional registration times. Sunday registration is held during Coaches and Captain's meeting at 3:45 PM on the Saturday preceding the race. **Faxed/Emailed seeding forms for Sunday competition will not be received.**
- B. Coaches and Captains may either send team registration forms via fax or submit the seeding form online. All seeding forms need to be turned in by the Wednesday preceding the race weekend. Each team Captain shall fill out a complete "A" team entry form (and "B" team form if necessary), giving the names and bib numbers of the racers, the category in which entering, and their respective starting order. Seeding forms will be made available if teams have not already completed them. A list of bibs will also be made available to each captain if necessary.
- C. The Vice President will accept seeding forms, check eligibility, and assign new bibs if necessary. The treasurer will check financial status and accept all payments.
- D. New bibs must be purchased at this time. New bib numbers are permanent throughout the extent of the racer's participation within the Conference. They may only be purchased through the SCCSC. Old bib numbers become invalid when they are lost or retired, and bibs may not be exchanged or sold back to the SCCSC. It is the racer's responsibility to race under the correct bib number.
- E. The race courses shall be inspected by the President and the mountain race director. They shall then make any changes they deem necessary. Officials of the ski area have the authority to cancel any Conference ski race.
- F. Final decision to cancel any Conference race that is already in progress rests with the Jury Committee.
- G. Refunds for tickets purchased for a race canceled in progress will be the decision of the Race Department.

## **Section 11**

### **Racing Order and Seeding**

- A. See USCSA rule book section 3.7 for alpine seeding. Snowboard seeding for Giant Slalom follows alpine seeding exactly.
- B. The racing order shall be random within each seed of the member organizations.
- C. Only the first five seeds per sex count toward a team's score. This constitutes the "A" team racers and distinguishes them as the only scoring unit for a team.
- D. Teams with more than 10 "A" racers may enter the others in "B" team.
- E. Individual ranking within "A" teams shall be decided by the respective team Captain.
- F. If two courses are provided by the race department, one shall be used for the men's "A" team and the other for the women's "A" team.

- G. During any special event races the Executive Committee shall determine all racing orders to suit the occasion, providing the randomness of the draw is maintained.
- H. After the fourth qualifying race weekend prior to the Regional Championships, both the "A" and "B" race teams shall race on the same race hill and race course.

## **Section 12**

### Course Preparation and Inspection

- A. Refer to USCSA rule book for giant slalom and slalom.
- B. The Race Jury Committee will decide the method of inspection. If the course is open for slipping, a racer may slip slide down the course along the same path taken by a racer during their official run. If the course is closed to slipping, you may only inspect the course from along side, only entering the course by traversing to the gate, and after inspection, a racer must traverse directly out of the course.
- C. At no time may a racer "free ski" or "shadow" the event area. Making two or more consecutive turns is considered "free skiing." Running the race course parallel to the actual course, but outside all gates, is considered "shadowing."

- A. Refer to USCSA rule book.
- B. Racer must present a properly initialed and dated provisional re-run card, or protest sheet in order to be considered for a re-start. It is the responsibility of the racer to obtain a properly initialed card from an SCCSC Executive Committee member.

## **Section 16**

### Protests

- A. Refer to USCSA rule book for protests concerning alpine events.
- B. Refer to USCSA rule book for protests concerning snowboard events.
- C. Refer to USCSA rule book for protests concerning freestyle events.

## **Section 17**

### **Grounds for Disqualification**

- A. Refer to USCSA rule book. Any racer who continues to race after knowingly being disqualified will be disqualified from the following event.

## **Section 18**

### **Fines and Penalties**

- A. It is the Executive Committee's duty to collect and levy all fines and/or penalties. All debts must be paid before the next race weekend. Teams may not race until all fines are paid. All teams are responsible for fines levied against their racers.
- B. Failure to carry out assigned duties, such as, gatekeeping, handtiming, scoreboard, etc.:
  - 1. First Offense                    \$20
  - 2. Second Offense                \$30
  - 3. Third Offense        LOOSE team points for day. Review of team's season eligibility.
- C. Failure to carry out team member responsibilities such as visible bib, free skiing on race hill, swearing, drinking, etc. will result in the following fines:
  - 1. First Offense                    \$20
  - 2. Second Offense                \$30
  - 3. Third Offense                    \$40
  - 4. Three fines for a team in one weekend will have an additional fine of \$20.
- D. Late arrival for assigned duties will result in a fine of \$10.
- E. Failure to submit online race registration by Wednesday at Midnight is \$25 per occurrence.
- F. Failure to have bibs properly displayed during the race will result in a \$20 fine per instance and an automatic replacement bib charge.
- G. Teams running ineligible racers will result in team disqualification for that individual race. Individuals will retain their points and place standings.
- H. Interfering with Mountain Personnel, Executive Committee, Gatekeepers, Starters, Finishers, or a racer on course will result in a \$25 fine.
- I. Anyone associated with the SCCSC who tries to defraud the league, the mountain, or any other organization involved with our league will be fined \$100, will be expelled from the SCCSC, and may be subject to legal liability (both criminal and civil).
- J. Anyone abusing the provisional rerun privileges will be fined \$20.
- K. Persistent violation of the race rules by an individual racer or team, will result in either temporary or permanent disqualification.
- L. Protests of fines and/or penalties may be made to a quorum of the Assembly. The fine and/or penalty may be revoked by a two-thirds vote of the quorum.

## **Section 19**

### **Alcohol Policy – Racer Social Conduct**

Social activities are an important part of the life and atmosphere of the students enrolled in the member schools who participate in the Southern California Collegiate Snowsport Conference (SCCSC). It is recognized that these activities at times involve both the attendance of a substantial number of students under 21 years of age and the presence of alcoholic beverages. This SCCSC Student Alcohol Policy (hereinafter, the SAP) was developed with careful consideration to individual and community health and welfare issues as well as the realities of implementation.

The Policy is intended to apply to:

- A. Programs and events that are organized and sponsored by Registered Campus Organizations, at which attendance consists predominantly of students under 21 years of age and at which alcoholic beverages will be present.
- B. SCCSC-sponsored events at which attendance consists predominantly of students under 21 years of age and at which alcoholic beverages will be present.

The Policy is to be applied in conjunction with local, state, and federal laws, codes, and ordinances.

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

The SCCSC requires that individuals and groups choosing to offer alcoholic beverages at their programs and events operate within state and local laws and comply with responsible hosting guidelines, as outlined in this Policy.

In accordance with the SAP, alcoholic beverages may be present at events where attendance is likely to consist predominantly of students under 21 years of age only in regulated settings that give the highest priority to standards for student health, safety, and responsibility that apply across entire populations.

#### **Standards for Student Health, Safety, and Responsibility:**

The following standards are designed to promote student health, safety, and responsibility. Subject to the facility use and scheduling policies and constraints of the venue involved, alcoholic beverages may be served at programs and events where attendance is likely to consist predominantly of students under 21 years of age only under the following general provisions and specific conditions:

- a. The service and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages is to be complementary to the event; under no circumstances should an event have the consumption of alcohol as its primary purpose.
- b. All events at which alcohol is served must also include the provision of alternate non-alcoholic beverages and free or reasonably priced snacks throughout the duration of the event. If alcoholic beverages are sold, alternate non-alcoholic beverages may be reasonably priced; if alcohol is served free of charge, the alternate non-alcoholic beverages must also be complimentary.
- c. No one under 21 years of age may be served, or possess, alcoholic beverages. Staff or bartenders must ask for proof of age.
- d. The event sponsor is responsible for ensuring that all activities at which alcohol is to be present are planned and conducted in a manner that assures compliance with this SAP as well as state and local laws.

- e. The event sponsor is responsible for ensuring that all activities at which alcohol is to be present are planned and conducted in a manner that minimizes any risk to the health and safety of attendees. Drinking contests or games are strictly prohibited.
- f. Programs and events at which alcohol is present and where attendance is likely to consist predominantly of students under 21 years of age shall not be open to the public. Attendance shall be by invitation to selected members of the campus community (and their guests) who can be readily identified by procedures or mechanisms typically used to determine membership in the campus community (e.g., University-Issued Student Identity Cards).
- g. No registered campus organization may co-sponsor or co-finance an event at which alcoholic beverages are purchased by any of the sponsoring organizations.
- h. The purchase of alcoholic beverages may not be coordinated by any one person on behalf of a registered campus organization.
- i. Promote advertising that integrates the message of social norms and harm reduction, and not those that encourage alcohol consumption.
- j. Promote the message of individual and group harm reduction, through the mandatory use and encouragement of designated drivers at all events when alcoholic beverages are served.

#### **ALCOHOL-RELATED ADVERTISEMENT**

Advertisements that reference alcoholic beverages, in any form (e.g., print ads, e-mail or website announcements, banners, signs, flyers, t-shirts, etc.), may not portray drinking as a means to academic or social success, associate alcohol with the performance of tasks that require skilled reactions such as the driving of an automobile, suggest that drinking is the sole purpose or dominant theme of an event, or promote alcohol consumption as an expectation during the event or activity.

Print advertisements that incorporate an alcoholic beverage trademark or logo must display the trademark/logo as clearly subordinate to the message concerning the event itself. The name of an alcoholic beverage manufacturer or distributor may not be connected to the name of the event itself, but may be listed as a sponsor of a specific event.

#### **VIOLATION OF STUDENT ALCOHOL POLICY**

The SCCSC will provide education, assessment, counseling and referral services for students addressing alcohol-related issues.

Discipline may be imposed upon organizations or individual students in accordance with basic standards of procedural due process following the alleged violation of the Policy and the filing of written charges with. Discipline will be determined on a case-by-case basis, but can include:

- Fines for Misconduct
- Individual/Team Points Disqualified from race or from season
- Removal of Individual(s) from SCCSC competition for race weekend
- Removal of Individual(s) from SCCSC competition for race season
- Permanent Removal of Individual(s) from SCCSC program
- Removal of Team(s) from SCCSC competition for race weekend
- Removal of Team(s) from SCCSC competition for race season

## **Section 20**

### **Regional and National Championship Qualifications**

#### **A.**

##### **Alpine Regional Teams and Individual Selection**

1. For Alpine Ski regionals, Five men's teams and five women's teams will qualify for the Regional Championships. Also five men and five women will be chosen as individual competitors from teams that did not qualify as a team, to compete in Regionals. Men's and Women's teams will be scored separately for Regional events.
2. Selection will be based on the lowest points, after dropping the highest slalom and giant slalom finishes at the end of four race weekends.
3. The individual selection will be based on individuals with the highest point total, with one drop permitted for a low score race.
4. Any errors in the scoring or results should be reported immediately by the team Coach or Captain to the SCCSC. This must be done no later than the morning of the first registration of the next race weekend.
5. Team qualification to the USCSA Collegiate National Championship is determined by the top two male and top two female alpine teams through combined scoring of the Giant Slalom and Slalom competitions at the regional championship. Individual qualification to the USCSA Collegiate National Championship is granted to the top one male and top one female competitor not on either of the top two qualified teams.

#### **B.**

##### **Snowboard Regional Teams and Individual Selection**

1. For Snowboard regionals, all men's teams and all women's teams registered with the SCCSC will qualify for the Regional Championships. Men's and Women's teams will be scored separately for Regional events.
2. Team and Individual qualification to the USCSA Collegiate National Championship will be granted when a team or individual compete at both conference competitions and the regional competition.

#### **C.**

##### **Freestyle Regional Teams and Individual Selection**

1. For Freestyle Ski regionals, all men's teams and all women's teams registered with the SCCSC will qualify for the Regional Championships. Men's and Women's teams will be scored separately for Regional events.
2. Team and Individual qualification to the USCSA Collegiate National Championship will be granted when a team or individual compete at both conference competitions and the regional competition.

## Section 21

### Scoring and Awards

#### A.

#### Individual Scoring and Awards

1. Individual scores shall be independent of team scores.
2. Individual points for timed events are earned as a ratio of the racer's time compared to the winner's time. The winner for each race will earn 100 points. The remaining racers will receive points according to the following formula:

Place	Time (seconds)	Formula	Points Result

3. Individual points for place events (BoarderCross, Halfpipe, Slopestyle) will use the World Cup system outlined in section 5 below.
4. Individual season-to-date points are a summation of the number of races to date, unless more than four individual races have occurred. For end of season scoring, the top four races for each individual are summed to give them their overall individual point score. If less than four races occur during a season, then the total sum of all races will be used for each overall racer point total.
5. Scoring used to determine individual berths to Regionals uses the World Cup system (points updated to reflect FIS 03/04). The top 30 racers eligible for points are as follows:

6. Trophies/Plaques will be awarded to the top three women and top three men **skiers** overall for Giant Slalom, Slalom, SkierCross, Halfpipe and Slopestyle events. Trophies will be awarded to the top ~~ten~~ **three** women and the top ~~ten~~ **three** men skiers overall for combined events. **The top ten women and men in overall combined events will be recognized of some sort, while the top three will receive trophies.**
7. Trophies/Plaques will be awarded to the top three women and top three men **snowboarders** for Giant Slalom, BoarderCross, Halfpipe and Slopestyle events. Trophies will be awarded to the top ~~ten~~ **three** women and the top ~~ten~~ **three** men snowboarders overall for combined events. **The top ten women and men in overall combined events**

**will be recognized of some sort, while the top three will receive trophies.**<sup>8</sup>

8. Individual Combined scoring uses the sum of the placepoint finishes from each of the events held during the course of the season that are used to calculate the individual discipline awards. The racer with the lowest sum is the overall individual champion. World cup point scores are used to break a tie. If a tie still exists, then it remains a tie.

**B.**

**Team Scoring and Awards**

1. Scoring rules of the USCSA will be used for team scoring and are outlined in section 6 of the USCSA rule book.
2. Trophies/Plaques will be awarded to the top three men's and women's combined alpine ski teams, the top three men's and women's combined freestyle ski teams, as well as the top three men's and women's combined snowboard teams.

**C.**

**Men's and Women's Combined Ski & Snowboard Team Trophies**

1. A trophy shall be awarded each year to the top **combined ski & snowboard team** that has the lowest combined men's and women's point totals throughout the year. This team award includes all Skier Giant Slalom, Skier Slalom, SkierCross, Skier Halfpipe, Skier Slopestyle, Snowboarder Giant Slalom, BoarderCross, Snowboard Halfpipe and Snowboard Slopestyle.

- \* Past the November (Tuesday before Thanksgiving) deadline, you will automatically be issued a Restricted License. Restricted License means you are eligible to compete **only** in Conference races. Competing in Regionals and Nationals is prohibited. You may file for an extension of this deadline by submitting a request to the National Office for review. This must be submitted prior the deadline date.

#### I. **TEAMS DUES (Invoice) and MEMBERSHIP FORM:**

Fill this form out completely and accurately. Submit the form to the proper account disbursement authority at your school. Return to the USCSA National Office as soon as possible, with your payment included. ***Make a copy for your records.***

#### II. **INDIVIDUAL COMPETITOR NATIONAL REGISTRATION FORM:**

Each athlete on your team must complete this form. Send the original copy to the National Office and make a copy for your team records. *Your copy can be very useful in case of emergencies and keeping records of your team members.* The USCSA National Office must receive these forms prior to the Tuesday, November 23.

#### III. **SKI TEAM ELIGIBILITY FORM (Alpine and Cross Country):**

You will need a separate form for each discipline and each gender. Example: men's cross-country and women's alpine, you need two forms. Forms that are not completed correctly and legible *will be returned*. Send the original copy to the National Office and make a copy for your team records. (It is a good idea to carry this form with you to races, should there be any problems with a team member.) The USCSA National Office must receive this form/s prior the Tuesday, November 23.

##### *Simple Steps To Completing The Eligibility Form:*

- 1) Read Form 'US-101' and read the Highlights of Eligibility Rules sheet.
- 2) Fill in the College name and address, year of ski season, discipline and license.
- 3) Use one form for each discipline and gender.
- 4) Column #1, fill in each athletes name in alphabetical order, including their I.D.#.
- 5) Fill in columns #3 through #10. (Columns #11 - #15 are filled in by school officials.)
- 6) Column #2, student signature of each athlete.
- 7) a) Deliver to the Registrar or Certifying Official. b) Include Form 'US-101' and the Highlights of Eligibility Rules sheet. c) They must fill in columns #11 through #15 **and certify the other columns**. d) They must also use a college stamp or seal and complete the bottom of the form.
- 8) Include Special Enrollment Form for the Registrar or Certifying Official, if needed.
- 9) Have the form returned to you (the coach or team officer). Sign and date the form at the bottom and return the USCSA National Office. Make copy for your team records so that you know which of your athletes are eligible.

#### IV. **SNOWBOARD TEAM ELIGIBILITY FORM:**

The Registrar or Certifying Official must sign this form. See detailed instructions on the Snowboard Team Eligibility Form. The USCSA National Office must receive this form/s prior to the Tuesday, November 23. Make a copy for your team records.

**“USCSA Highlights of Eligibility Rules  
For Alpine and Cross-Country”**

Listed below are the *important points* of the USCSA eligibility rules. These do not cover all of the rules. *Each team is responsible for the eligibility of each of its members.*

1. Each athlete must be enrolled as a full-time student during the competition season.
2. Each athlete must maintain a minimum satisfactory GPA.
  - \* 1.6 after the first season of competition
  - \* 1.8 after the second season of competition
  - \* 2.0 after the third season of competition
3. Each athlete must have passed 24 semester hours or 36-quarter hours since the beginning of the last competition season.
4. Each athlete has ten semesters or fifteen quarters of full-time collegiate enrollment during which to use four years of eligibility. This starts with the initial semester or quarter enrolled in school.
5. Each athlete must be making “normal progress” in a degree program.
6. Freshmen competitors must follow the NCAA freshman-sliding rule, 14.3.2.1.
7. The amount of financial aid awarded to a student athlete is limited to the value of tuition and fees, room and board and required textbooks.
8. Transfer students may only use transfer credits accepted by the institution of which they are competing in determining eligibility. (You are allowed one free transfer. The second time you transfer, you must sit out one year. See NCAA rules for exceptions.)
9. No recruiting from existing collegiate programs is allowed without permission from the school involved. All inquires from students at other schools must be reported to the school from which the student desires to transfer.

1. a. If requesting a regular license – columns 1-15 must be completed.

c. **One** competitor from a restricted license team may fill out the complete eligibility form and receive a regular license.
2. Each team enters athlete information except for items marked with an asterisk \* (11-15). Athlete signature indicates information provided is correct under penalty of loss of eligibility.
3. This form must be signed by the team coach or officer in addition to college registrar or eligibility chairperson. Form will be rejected if only signed by team personnel or coach.
4. Deadline for submitting eligibility form as detailed under section V. (C) (1) of USCSA Eligibility Rules is the Tuesday prior to Thanksgiving Day.
5. When fully completed and certified by college official, send original copy to the USCSA National Office and make a copy for your team records.

**INSTRUCTIONS to COLLEGE OFFICIAL certifying information on this form:**

1. Please enter all items of information marked with an asterisk \* (11-15).
2. Student/athletes must be carrying minimum of 12 credits per semester or quarter during the competitive season, and be making normal progress toward an established degree or certificate program.
3. Freshmen competitors must have a minimum high school graduation CPA of 2.00 in core curriculum subjects and an SAT score of 700 or an ACT score of 15. GPA must be provided for freshmen eligibility. For exceptions, see USCSA Eligibility Rules.
4. Cross-out any competitor names that do not meet the standards of enrollment of student/athletes meeting indicated standards.
5. Place college seal on form and sign to verify enrollment of student/athletes meeting indicated standards.
6. Under column 13, indicate the credit hours earned for the previous academic year (September 1 - August 31).

**INSTRUCTION for Special Eligibility Conditions:**

1. A copy of the Military Discharge papers (DD-214 Form) must be enclosed for students who become eligible as a result of armed service experience.
2. Students who establish eligibility by passing GED tests must enclose verification of test results.
3. Transfer information section must be filled out for all transfer students including information from all schools formerly attended.
4. Any student/athlete having non-concurrent enrollment at any time since enrolling in college must fill out the Explanation of Part-time or Non-concurrent College Attendance section below.

**TRANSFER STUDENTS:**

**PART-TIME OR NON-CONCURRENT COLLEGE ATTENDANCE STUDENTS:**

# Southern California Collegiate Snowsport Conference 2010-2011 Waiver & Release of Liability



## PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING. THIS IS A RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND WAIVER OF CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS

In consideration for the rights and privileges associated with competing in the Southern California Collegiate Ski and Snowboard Conference, Inc., (hereinafter referred to as "SCCSC"), the undersigned acknowledges and agrees to be bound by the following:

1. The undersigned, if over 18 years of age, has read and signed this Waiver and Release of Liability. If the undersigned is **UNDER** 18 years of age, then **IN ADDITION** to his/her signature, this Waiver and Release has been read and signed by his/her parent or legal guardian. (The undersigned is hereinafter referred to collectively as "Competitor")

2. Competitor accepts and understands that skiing and snowboarding in their various forms are **HAZARDOUS** sports that have many dangers and risks.

Competitor further understands that events tangential to skiing and snowboarding with the SCCSC, may also be hazardous, such as parties, banquets, commuting, attending meetings, and other dangers not specifically identified herein.

It is further understood that training, competing, or racing competitively is more **HAZARDOUS** than recreational activities. Additionally, Competitor acknowledges that there are attendant dangers in commuting to events, event social functions, meetings, and other dangers not necessarily specifically identified herein. Competitor realizes that injuries are a common and ordinary occurrence of this sport, or in the events tangential to this sport. Competitor agrees as a condition of being allowed participation in any skiing or snowboarding activity, including but not limited to, preparation for participation in, coaching, and related activities in alpine, nordic, freestyle, and snowboarding competitions and clinics, or in the course of travel to or from any such event, attending meetings, attending social functions (such as parties and banquets), (hereinafter "Activity"), involves risks of serious injury, including permanent disability, death and other losses, both to Competitor and his/her property. Competitor understands that these injuries and losses might result not only from his/her actions, but the actions, inactions, or negligence of others. Member freely accepts and voluntarily **ASSUMES ALL RISKS OF PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH** from any Activity affiliated, related to, or in any way associated with the SCCSC, its officers, employees, agents, directors, and/or executive committee members.

Competitor agrees with the premise that Competitor is a Competitor at all times, whether practicing for competition or in competition. Competitor agrees that he/she is always provided an opportunity to conduct a reasonable visual inspection of the training or race course. Competitor understands that he/she will be held to assume the risk of all course conditions including but not limited to, weather and snow conditions, course construction or layout and obstacles.

3. Competitor hereby assumes all risks which may be associated with and/or result from his/her involvement in such Activity and hereby holds **HARMLESS, RELEASES, INDEMNIFIES, AND DEFENDS**, the SCCSC, USCSA, its subsidiaries and affiliates, their respective Executive Committee members, officers, directors, agents, employees, coaches, trainers, doctors, officials, event organizers, the ski area, or sponsors (hereinafter "SCCSC"), of and from any liability, claims, demands, actions, and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage or injury, including death, that may be sustained by Competitor while participating in the Activity, including, but not limited to, those injuries and damages caused by the negligence and/or breach of warranty, expressed or implied, on the part of the SCCSC.

Competitor covenants not to sue SCCSC, its Executive Committee members, officers, directors, agents, employees, coaches, trainers, doctors, officials, event organizers, the ski area, or sponsors for any injury befalling him/her from any Activity.

4. By execution of this release Competitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the SCCSC for claims or demands from any injury to Competitor or other person(s) or property which may arise as a result of Competitor engaging in Activity.

5. Competitor authorizes SCCSC (as previously defined in paragraph 3), Mammoth Mt. Ski Area, and/or its authorized personnel to call for medical care for him/her or to transport him/her to a medical facility or hospital if, in the opinion of such personnel, medical attention is needed for him/her. SCCSC is not required to do so, and, in its discretion, may choose not to. In the event SCCSC does summon or transport Competitor to a medical facility or hospital, Competitor agrees that upon his/her transport to any such medical facility or hospital that SCCSC shall not have further responsibility for him/her. Competitor further understands that SCCSC will not provide or advance funds for medical care. # **Ski and Snowboard Team Maintenance**

---

## **Officers**

The selection of team officers is crucial to the team's success. It is a good idea to select officers that are extremely motivated to run the team and genuinely interested in the team's success. Teams should have no more than four to six officers. For any team the minimum number of positions required consist of: President/Team Captain, Treasurer, Pro-Deal Officer.

## **President/Voting Member**

Primary contact for all SCCSC communication. The President/Voting Member is responsible for making all executive decisions concerning operation of their specific team. Must attend all official SCCSC meetings and is the voting member of the board of directors of the SCCSC. Responsible for submitting all necessary SCCSC registration paperwork by deadlines. All SCCSC hosting duties fall on the President to arrange with members of the member team.

## **Marketing/ProDeal Contacts (2)**

Primary contact(s) for the SCCSC Marketing department. Each member team should have either 1 or 2 people in this position. The responsibilities should be broken down based on skiing and snowboarding disciplines. The duties of this position will include working towards an increased awareness of the SCCSC in their member community and increased awareness with administration. Responsible for developing an effective plan of disseminating information about SCCSC equipment sponsors in the form of pro-deals. Provides contact information for administration at member university.

## **Treasurer**

Responsible for the collection and disbursement of funds, and providing financial reports to the Assembly during meetings. The Treasurer sets and maintains the member team budget in conjunction with the President. Assigns fees, collects fines, and reports team status to the President. Primary contact for the SCCSC Financial Officer.

## **Seeding Contacts (2) i.e. Ski / Snowboard Team Captains**

Primary contact for the SCCSC statistician. Each member team must have either 1 or two people in this position to handle all race seeding for the member university. The responsibilities of the seeding officers should be split across skiing and snowboarding disciplines. This position should provide race results to their team members. During racer registration, responsible for all seeding forms and verifying racer status; including, registration fees, academic eligibility, and individual liability release.

Larger teams may find that they need more officers to handle the team's operations. These teams may have additional officers such as Vice President, Secretary, Fundraising Officer, Team Ski/Snowboard Coaches and Captains.

It is up to the previous officers to select, appoint, or nominate new officers for the upcoming season. Once potential officers have been identified, the team may opt to have elections where each team member votes to select the new officers. With some teams, the Captains are determined by taking the highest ranking officers or racers if no officers have been chosen. However, it is up to each team to determine what officer structure works best for them. Each team must also update the SCCSC Executive Board with contact information for new officers.

## **Meetings**

Ski & Snowboard Team meetings should be held either every week or every other week during the school year. It is important to start holding the meetings as soon as school starts in the fall. The best days are usually Tuesday or Wednesday nights. If there are interested students who can not attend the meeting due to a conflicting class, make sure to have all of the team information and registration materials given, mailed, e-mailed, on the internet, or available during the day at the team's recruiting table.

Most schools will allow you to hold meetings on campus or in the Student Union/University Center. These locations are best as they are easiest for on-campus students and freshmen to reach. Make sure to schedule a room on campus during the end of the school year or during the summer to ensure that there will be space available in the Fall. On-campus meeting rooms fill up quickly and there is a rush to schedule rooms at the start of the year. Make sure that the room you choose for your team's meeting is accessible, centrally located and easy to find. Many new students will not know their way around campus and may not know where your meeting room is located.

## **Dues**

Membership dues for members can be structured in a number of ways. Each team must determine the best dues structure for their team that corresponds with the team's expenditures. There are a number of different factors that can determine how much to charge team members:

- Does your team receive any money from your school?
- Does your team receive any money from fundraising activities?
- Does your team rent or lease a house in Mammoth for the entire season or just on a weekend-to-weekend basis?
- Are team members charged a lump sum at the beginning of the quarter/semester/year that covers their registration costs for the season?
- Are team members charged registration fees on a race-to-race basis?

It is important to consider these questions and other variables such as fees that teams have to pay to the SCCSC, USCSA and any other school sanctioned fees before deciding on the appropriate amount that covers the costs of running the team but at the same time does not discourage potential team members from joining the team due to high costs.

## **Budgets**

Some Universities require that each club team submit a budget in the beginning of the season to make sure that the teams are fiscally on-track for the season as well as they are used to allocate funding to the specific teams. Make sure that you incorporate all possible costs so you are not running a deficit. Use the provided template as a first start for getting your finances squared away. This excel document format will allow you to discover what size of a team you want based on the per person dues to join. For any additional advice on budget setting, get in contact with the SCCSC President or Treasurer.

## **Registration**

The registration process is more and more web based. As such, to ensure that the process is completed in a timely manner, a good idea is to have a team meeting once your roster is set where registration can be done in a group setting. You'll need a couple of laptop computers on wireless internet and a decent printer (small inkjets work perfect) to print forms. Have each member register, answer their questions, and print their forms. Once all members have registered, print the team form and have all racers sign it. You are now ready in one meeting to present the team forms to your registrar's office.

## **Pro-Deals**

Securing pro-deals on ski and snowboard equipment is also an important part of ski and snowboard team management. Pro-deals can allow team members to purchase equipment, clothing, and accessories at greatly reduced prices before the season starts. Pro-deals can be obtained from almost every major ski and snowboard company in the United States and Europe. However, quantities are limited and sell out quickly. It is a good idea to order equipment as early as possible to ensure delivery before the first race. Pro-deals are considered a privilege and it is important not to abuse this privilege by allowing non-team members to order equipment.

The SCCSC works to securing some primary pro-deals for all the teams in the league. Please check with Kazusa Nishii for the most current status on league-wide pro-deals for skiers and snowboarders. Kazusa can be reached at [kazusa@scpsc.com](mailto:kazusa@scpsc.com).

## **Hosting**

Each team will need to Host a race weekend as defined in the Red Book. The duties of the host team are listed in the Race Info of this manual. It is a good idea to assign roles the week prior to the race and contact the volunteers multiple times throughout the week to ensure they understand the duties they are to perform and when they are to perform them. Performing the duties assigned is important for the Host team as failure to do so can result in loss of team points for the race event.

Small teams who are required to host (chosen in order of team placement the prior year) can join up with a larger team who does not have an assigned weekend to help fill the ranks.

## **Bibs**

Bibs are issued to each racer on each team for use in races with the SCCSC. The bib is the property of the SCCSC and not part of the dues paid by each racer. As such, the bib must be returned to the SCCSC at the end of the season. Failure to return the bib to the SCCSC at the completion of the race season will result in a charge of \$15 per bib to the team which the bib was assigned and recorded.

It is recommended that all team captains keep a tally of bibs issued to their teams and collect the fine from team members who receive additional bibs from the SCCSC. Additionally, it is strongly recommended that when returning bibs to the SCCSC, officers should have a count of how many are turned in such that if record keeping can be kept in check.

## **Bib Deposits**

Each team will be charged a bib deposit for which bib charges will be deducted throughout the season. The remaining balance of each bib deposit will be refunded to teams at the end of the season. The value of the deposit is based on the number of people on each team, the value is listed in the fees section.

## **Team Banquet**

The SCCSC hosts an awards banquet each spring to celebrate the achievements and recognize top racers in the league. It is a nice gesture to host a team banquet (bbq, pool party, etc.) and recognize those on your team who have gone the extra mile to make the year a success. Something like this can be cheap and ensure that racers return the following year.

# Securing Housing for the Winter

---

Another crucial aspect of the ski and snowboard team management is finding adequate team housing in Mammoth Lakes. Finding a house can be tricky in that many potential landlords do not want to rent to a college team. However, by looking for a house early in the season and exploring all possible options, it is possible to find a good team house. Many teams do not identify themselves as a ski team and instead identify themselves as individuals when they are looking for housing.

Some ideas for housing:

- Place a classified as in the Mammoth Times "Want to Rent" section of the paper that says you are looking for a short term lease during the winter months. The Mammoth Times is a weekly community newspaper that comes out every Thursday in Mammoth Lakes. This is a great resource for checking For Rent ads as well. You can view the current classifieds online at [www.mammothtimes.com](http://www.mammothtimes.com).
- Contact a local Mammoth Lakes realty office for a list of rental units. Many times a condo or house that is for sale is also available for a short term lease while it is on the market. This can be a great opportunity to obtain housing at a reduced price and not be locked into a long term lease.
- Consider sharing a house/condo with other ski and snowboard teams in the SCCSC. This is a good opportunity for smaller teams to obtain housing without incurring a lot of costs.
- Many condos and motels can accommodate up to four or more people. If your team has limited resources, consider renting motel rooms and having team members split the cost between them.

The best bet for you to find a property is to go to the Mammoth Times newspaper and look at the local listings. They are updated every week (as the Mammoth Times is a weekly paper). They update Wednesday afternoon or evening and are published hardcopy on Thursday. Consider both furnished and non-furnished houses, condos and apartments. Usually securing season lodging is difficult this early in the season, but it's a good idea to start looking now and get a feel for the market. Keep every week's listings of the Mammoth Times as a reference to compare prices as well as give an idea of what's out there.

You can also try to contact real estate agencies to try and rent property that may be on the market for sale. Rental Agencies who handle privately owned properties are more difficult and are less willing to deal with young people or groups of people. Make calls now to get an idea as to how people will respond to you. Many people are scared of teams, but if you do the math, there is usually less wear and tear on a house for six months by a team of people who come up occasionally on weekends than by a family of 4 who live in the house for 6 months straight.

Many of the universities do not want to get involved with renting houses, so you will have to rent them on your own, using your own credit history and the credit history of a few others on the team. Be prepared to make drives to Mammoth on a whim. In past seasons officers have made as many as 3 trips up before the season began to look for houses, meet landlords, and scout out property by driving around town (which has not proven helpful and is not recommended). If you are seeking season lodging and don't have a house by mid-November, start to panic. Consider having a backup plan for the new years race just in case you can't

secure a house to rent. You might want to call at the end of October to reserve a place (condo) if you don't yet have a house, but be aware of the cancellation policy (sometimes 3+ weeks in advance of the time using the property) so you don't get charged for a place you end up not using.

Renting a house is a lot of work, but can be really beneficial. Make sure that the landlord is aware you will be using the property mostly on the weekends and that during the week nobody will be in the house. This is important if there are specific things that need to be done so the house does not end up with frozen pipes, etc.

Once you have secured a house in Mammoth, make sure that you sign a lease. Ask about any specific things you need to worry about when you will be gone during the week. **Take pictures and videotape the walkthrough of the house and make note of every item that could be cause for not returning your security deposit.** During the course of your tenancy, keep track of every phone conversation you have with the landlord/property owner. Note the date, the person you spoke to, estimated length of conversation and a summary of each conversation. Save all email correspondence, save all utilities payments, all letters to the landlord, and keep track of all checks sent to the landlord. At the end of the season, make sure you do a thorough cleaning of the property, including steam cleaning the carpets (steam cleaners can be rented at Vons and are inexpensive), disinfecting bathrooms, sinks, kitchens, and refrigerators. All of these things are important both, so you can hopefully convince the landlords to rent to you in the future, and, so you can get all or most of your security deposit back at the end of the season.

# Recruiting

---

**Recruiting is the single most important aspect of ski team management.** No ski and snowboard team can survive without a strong recruiting program. There are many ways for a team to promote itself without incurring a lot of expenses.

One of the most important groups to target during recruiting are freshmen. A large group of freshmen will ensure that a team remains strong for several years. However, freshmen often are interested in joining many different types of activities so it is important to recruit them early before they commit to another sport/activity.

When placing recruiting advertisements, it is important to emphasize all of the great benefits that ski and snowboard team members receive. Here are some points to *a/ways* include on all of your recruiting materials:

- Discount lift tickets at Mammoth Mountain
- Free Ski and Snowboard Race Training at Mammoth Mountain
- Great prices on all types of ski and snowboard equipment, accessories and clothing.
- Cheap lodging in Mammoth Lakes
- Lots of fun events and chances to meet lots of other racers from Southern California schools, not to mention the chance to get in a lot of skiing and boarding!!

Make sure to copy recruiting flyers on bright colored paper such as yellow or red. After you have made up eye-catching posters/flyers, make sure to post them all around campus. Before posting, make sure your university does not require approval to post; otherwise you will be wasting time and resources from posters/flyers being removed. Most flyers are ineffective unless they are seen by someone at least three times. Here are some good locations to post flyers and banners:

- On campus designated posting kiosks
- On-and off-campus dorms
- Sorority/Fraternity houses
- Classrooms
- Bathrooms
- University Center
- ATM machines
- Campus libraries
- Off campus – Restaurants, Shops, Bars

Big banners and signs can also be a good way to recruit new members. You can usually buy inexpensive butcher paper at your local campus bookstore. Make sure to always list the benefits of being on the team, that all abilities of skier's and snowboarders are welcome, and most important, the team's meeting time, day and location. A contact name and number, as well as an email address, should also be included.

## **Freshmen Orientation Meetings**

Many schools have a freshmen orientation week right before school starts. Other schools may have periodic orientations throughout the summer before school starts. Often, the orientation programs will include a special program on the sports teams/clubs/campus activities that are available for the students to join. This can be a great way to introduce freshmen to all the benefits of joining a ski and snowboard team. Since the orientations are held before school starts in the fall, arrange a time to speak in person, make sure to provide the Orientation Programs staff with plenty of information about the ski and snowboard team.

## **Freshmen Orientation Booklets/Handouts**

Many schools also distribute a booklet for all incoming freshmen that feature useful information. This can be a great source for introducing incoming freshmen to the ski and snowboard team. Many Orientation booklets will accept advertisements and this can be a cost effective way to advertise in something the students will have throughout the year.

## **Newspaper ads**

Student Activities Section of the Newspaper: Some college newspapers have a special section at the beginning of each week that is devoted to all of the student club activities that are going on during the week. Many of these sections will allow you to include your ski and snowboard meeting for free in the section each week. This can be a great way to get free advertising for your meeting. Contact your campus activities center to see if they have a weekly section each week in the newspaper.

Classified Newspaper ads: Classified ads can also be a great way to advertise your teams meeting. These ads are usually inexpensive and campus organizations/clubs may be able to get a discount. It is best to run the ad the day before and the day of the meeting. Make sure to include the meeting date, time, location, and any email or web site address that your team has. Also put a phone number in so they can reach an officer if they have questions.

Display Ads: These are big ads (1/8 page to full page) that can be expensive to run depending on your student newspaper. However, these ads can also be a lot more effective than a classified ad – and can give you the opportunity to list some of the benefits of a team membership. The best time to run a display ad is just prior to the day of your first orientation meeting.

## **Activities Fairs**

Your school's Activities Fair or Club Day is a great opportunity to distribute information about the team. Make sure to have a table near the end of the aisle or near other sport-related clubs to ensure everyone will see your booth. You should have plenty of informational handouts, race schedules, and team t-shirts or pictures available for people to look at. Bring props such as skis, poles, snowboards, and boots so as to draw attention to your booth. Also, bring a banner for the front of the table that has the team name so that everyone can find the table. If you have access to electrical power, consider bringing a TV/VCR/DVD to show ski and snowboard movies to get people excited about snow season. It is a good idea to have at least two or three people from the team at the booth at all times to answer questions and talk to potential team members. Try to have both skiers and snowboarders at the booth. If your team has team shirts, it is a good idea to have everyone who is helping in the recruiting process wear their team shirts as this makes it easier for people to see you and you stand out. Make sure to also have an interest list where people can sign up with their name, email address and phone number. This will become your database for potential teammates.

## **Sports Activities Fairs**

Some schools may also have a sports activities fair that features all of the sports clubs available for students to join. This can be a great opportunity to distribute information about the team, but remember, each team is competing against each other for the student's memberships. Make sure to have plenty of information and fun things to display at your table in order to attract the most people to your team's booth.

## **Booths at the University Center**

Most schools will also let you set up a table in front of the Student Union or University Center or other heavily trafficked area. It is a good idea to have two to three team members sit at a table at least three times a week during peak student traffic times such as 10-2pm. This is also a great opportunity to distribute information to potential team members and get the word out about how much fun being on the team is.

## **Ski Club Meetings**

If your school has a separate Ski Club, it is a good idea to attend the first informational meeting and get permission to talk about the ski and snowboard team. This can be a great recruiting tool as many students confuse the ski club and the ski team and would really like to join the ski team instead. Again, make sure to have lots of information available to distribute. Other ideas are to offer discounted memberships for students who want to participate in both clubs, or consider merging both clubs together.

## **Social Events**

Another great way to attract potential members is to hold a recruiting event such as a BBQ or beach bonfire to give potential team members an opportunity to meet the existing team.

## **Team Website and Email**

The SCCSC offers web site hosting on the SCCSC server, but we are not able to offer development services. Your website would be [yourschool.sccsc.com](http://yourschool.sccsc.com). You may also want to ask your club sports office if they already have a site set up for club sports teams. Consider linking your page to popular search engines such as Google or Yahoo! so it can be brought up during web searches. Also, make sure to include your web page address and email address on all of your recruiting advertisements. Your team website must adhere to the SCCSC and USCSA online community policies and, you must link to both the SCCSC website ([www.sccsc.com](http://www.sccsc.com)) and the USCSA website ([www.uscsa.com](http://www.uscsa.com)).

## **Word of mouth...tell everyone you know how great the team is!**

Spreading the word about the ski team can be one of the best and easiest recruiting tools you have. Many potential team members may not even know that a team exists at your school. Make sure to tell everyone you know about the team, as you never know when they might know someone that is interested. During your orientation week and first week of school, try to get your teammates from the previous season to all wear their shirts. You can even have 1/4 page flyers that your teammates can hand out as they walk to class. If you belong to a sorority or fraternity, make an announcement at your weekly meeting about the ski and snowboard team, and post meeting information at the house. If you have team members that live in on- or off-campus residence halls, or apartment complexes, have them put up flyers and make announcements at their dorm/residence hall meetings.

## **Online Community Guidelines**

---

As a member organization of the SCCSC, all online activity must adhere to the corporate objectives of the SCCSC. Each team website must adhere to the following guidelines:

1. Corporate Branding linking the Team website to the SCCSC home page with SCCSC logo and statement "Part of the USCSA's Southern California Collegiate Snowsport Conference."
2. Corporate Branding linking the Team website to the USCSA home page with USCSA logo and statement "Part of the USCSA's Southern California Collegiate Snowsport Conference."
3. All photography placed on team websites must use common sense – posting of images at non-sanctioned events jeopardizes the legitimacy of the SCCSC. Fines, and possible disqualification, will be imposed to any team if these types of images are found on team websites.

## **SCCSC Ownership of Marketing**

---

As a member organization of the SCCSC, all aspects of SCCSC competition are owned solely by the SCCSC and the USCSA.

1. All photos taken on an SCCSC sanctioned race course are the property of the SCCSC and the USCSA.
2. All marketing that takes place as a result of each individual team under the understanding of competition in SCCSC competition is solely owned by the SCCSC and the USCSA.

Any member University entering into a marketing agreement with a sponsor deemed detrimental to the mission of the SCCSC and USCSA will be placed on competitive probation until the agreement has been terminated or a suitable resolution is reached.

Every racer will make two runs UNLESS they are disqualified for the following reasons:

- DSQ - Disqualified for missing a gate, or losing equipment
- DNF - Did Not Finish the Race
- DNS - Did Not Start the Race

*\*Exceptions: Start times may be delayed or changed depending on course set & weather.*

**RE-SETTING THE COURSE:** Race Officials will reset the course slightly between skier's and snowboarders when it is necessary, and between first run and second run.

**INSPECTING THE COURSE, TIMED EVENTS:** For timed events, the race course will be set up and open for racer inspection for 1 hour prior to race start. Racers must side-slip or snowplow through the course along the path taken by a racer, or along the side of the gates outside the race line. **All racers must wear bibs to slip the course.** Linking two or more consecutive turns on the race course or to the side of the course is considered free-riding and is not permitted and will lead to racer disqualification. Shadowing, free-riding off to the side of the course mirroring the turns in the course, is not permitted and will lead to racer disqualification. Course inspection closes 10 minutes before the start of the each race.

**INSPECTING THE COURSE, NON-TIMED EVENTS:** For non-timed events (X, SS, HP), the race course will be set up and open for racer inspection not later than 1 hour prior to race start. Racers may ride the course at full speed and are encouraged to progress from slow speeds to full speeds over the course of many runs to prevent injury. Portions of the course may be temporarily closed for course repair and racers should use caution at all times. **All racers must wear bibs to slip the course.**

**HOSTING:** Teams hosting a race must have four (4) team members working each race. Hosting teams are responsible for being at the mountain by 8:15. Host Team Race Workers will receive instruction from the SCCSC Executive Board each race day morning per the schedule above. For more information, please see the Host Team Responsibilities sheet.

**BIBS:** You **MAY NOT race without a bib**. If a racer has forgotten their bib, they are responsible for telling a team captain prior to registration on race day. A new bib will be assigned for all lost bibs and a fine will be charge, see Fees. Bibs must be worn properly, with numbers clearly visible at all times while on the race hill, including while slipping the course during the inspection period. Altering, defacing, modifying, etc. of bibs is not tolerated and will result in a fine and new bib issue.

**SEEDING:** Individual seeding is done by team captains, typically based on racers' finish order. Start order for the second and the second race seeding is done by league officials

based on times from the first race. The top 15 times are reversed and the second race begins with the 15th place finisher. This is called BIBO. After the 1st place finisher races, the order continues with the 16th through the last place finisher. BIBO order may be lowered depending on the number of racers present. Team order within a seed is random for each seed.

**EQUIPMENT (SKIERS):** If you lose a ski on the course, you MUST ski off the course. If you lose one pole, you may finish with three pieces of equipment. In a slalom course, if you wipe out at one of the last two gates, you may finish with two pieces of equipment. In a Giant Slalom course, if you wipe out at the last gate, you may finish with two pieces of equipment. The full rule book is posted online at [www.sccsc.com](http://www.sccsc.com) for your review.

**HIKING:** If you wipe out and both skis are still attached to your feet, you may finish the course. If you have slid past a gate without crossing the plane between the two flags, you must hike up and cross through the gate. Both feet must cross the plane. If you happen to straddle a gate, you must hike up and cross the plane with both feet.

**RE-RUNS:** If you feel you have had an unfair race due to an impeding skier or loose race equipment on your course, you must find an SCCSC Executive Board member and get an initialed re-run card. Abusing this privilege will result in a fine.

**PROTESTS:** Protests must be filed within 15 minutes after the DSQ list has been posted (immediately following the last racer). Notify an SCCSC Executive Board member; not the mountain Race Department. Information regarding protests can be found in the USCSA discipline rule books located at [www.USCSA.com](http://www.USCSA.com).

**FINES:** Fines, and possible disqualification, may apply in any of the below situations:

1. Bib not visible at all times when on the race course, including course inspection.
2. Free-skiing/riding on a set race course.
3. Swearing during your race or while on the course, start gate, or finish corral.
4. Arguing with SCCSC Officials or the Mammoth Mountain Race Department.
5. Alcohol of any kind at the Start, Finish, or on the course.

**LIFT TICKETS:** All racers are entitled to a reduced price lift ticket on race days. Bring picture I.D. and your bib with you. Tickets are sold in the Cafeteria (on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Main Lodge) next to the SCCSC Registration Area in Roma's Room. **Tickets are only available for members of your roster; abuse of this privilege will result in termination of the reduced price ticket to your team or the SCCSC at large. DO NOT ABUSE THIS PRIVILEGE.**

**RACE DEPARTMENT:** Racers are not to approach the Mammoth Mountain Race Department directly. If a racer has a problem, it should be reviewed with a team captain, officer, or any of the SCCSC Executive Board members. Protests are to be filed with SCCSC TD of the race, and will be resolved via Race Jury decision. The race department will not resolve problems as they are employed by the SCCSC to facilitate race setup and execution only.

**REGISTRATION:** Captains should come to registration on behalf of their racers to make seed changes, replace bibs, etc. Registration is in Roma's Room on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Main Lodge at Mammoth Mountain.

**REGISTRATION, JUNE MOUNTAIN:** Registration at June Mountain will be set up at a table in the ticket building at the bottom parking lot. It is crucial to arrive on time to June Mountain events as there is significant time required to reach the race course from the base. Registration will close promptly, and tickets will be sold only until 10 AM. Race tickets can be purchased at Mammoth the day before as multi-day tickets, otherwise tickets will not be available at Mammoth on race days when the event is at June Mountain.

## **Accidents & Insurance**

---

In the event that there is an accident on the course, proper documentation must be completed and signed by parties involved to protect the liability of the SCCSC and to insure that the SCCSC is co-operating with the insurance provided by NSSP and Lawson Insurance, LLC.

Every member team of the SCCSC must take these situations seriously.

Proper Accident protocol is to inform the SCCSC staff so the SCCSC can work with Mammoth Mountain to complete the necessary paperwork. Please notify SCCSC staff as soon as possible, either via a phone call to an SCCSC Executive Board member or via a phone call to the host mountain race department.

If you can not reach any of the SCCSC staff on the date of the accident, please contact any of the SCCSC staff using the provided contact list and leave a detailed message about what took place. Please leave your name, address, and email so the SCCSC can get in contact with you promptly.

# Race Weekend Hosting

---

It is policy that certain teams will *Host* a race throughout the year, typically one team per weekend, although this responsibility can be shared by agreeing teams. The host team helps run the competitions of a given weekend by providing volunteer help to perform functions that there simply are not enough SCCSC Race Staff to perform for the race. These duties include posting times on the scoreboard for timed races, setting up and removing banners and flags to promote the race, calling the start order, taking photographs throughout the race, and more.

Hosting teams are selected in order of the previous season's results with the top finishing team gets to select which weekend the following season they wish to host, then the second team selects, etc. This process repeats itself until all the races have been assigned a host team.

The race day schedules in the Team Manual give the timing for all of the following roles which may be required of the Host team. These position descriptions can be used in conjunction with the schedule so that each Host team understands what is expected while hosting.

**In compliance with the by-laws of the SCCSC, Section 7, and Section 18, of the SCCSC Redbook, failure to carry out assigned duties can result in a fine or penalty.**

## Host Team Volunteer Responsibilities:

### Team President / Host Organizer

This person will be responsible for all host team volunteers, ensuring that each is on time to post and fulfills their duties as assigned. This person is also responsible for ensuring that a newsletter article is written by the Host Team about their experience during their host weekend (see newsletter below).

**-President / Organizer must report to registration at 8:15 AM each race day to pick up an SCCSC Radio for communication with the executive staff.** The radio is to remain on the President / Organizer until the afternoon captains meeting or the day's competitions are complete.

### Course Prep Crew / Course Tear Down Crew

The course prep crew is to meet the team President / Organizer and SCCSC staff at 8:30 AM at registration for instruction. These crews should consist of 2 to 3 people but could be as small as a single person, and may be the same people in both the morning prep crew and afternoon tear down crew, are responsible for hanging all SCCSC provided advertising and publicity items on and around the race course. The tear down crew should give the items to the President / Organizer to return to the SCCSC at the afternoon captain's meeting.

### Photographer

This person should meet the SCCSC Chief of Race / TD / President at the top of the course prior to race start times and will be responsible for photographing the races assigned by the host team President / Organizer. A single person may take on this duty for the duration of the hosting period, or it may be shared amongst many. Photos should be taken of racers while on course as well as in the start area and finish corral. The photos will be posted on online forums for all to enjoy. Inappropriate photos will be delete and may result in fines or other team punishment depending on the content. The SCCSC can provide a digital camera, however if teams have a nice camera that is able to be used, photos will be downloaded from memory cards daily.

### Assistant Starter

The Assistant Starter of the scoreboard team is responsible for calling off the bib numbers in order of the start list and lining up the racers in the starting gate. There should always be a line of ten racers, in order, from the starting gate. This person should meet with the SCCSC Chief of Race / TD / President at the top of the course 5 minutes prior to the start of the race.

**Scoreboard Responsibilities:**

Two members of the hosting team are needed assist with updating the scoreboard as racers finish their races. Each station must be occupied by one team member at all times during the race. These positions will need to rotate during the race so all team members get a chance to race. Typically the ski race should be worked by snowboarders and vice versa.

**Timing Shack Score Keeper** - The Timing Shack Score Keeper will sit beside the Timer in the timing shack and will communicate with the Scoreboard Keeping via two way headset. The Timing Shack Score Keeper will communicate the bib number and race time of all athletes on the course to the Scoreboard Keeper. This position should be consistent throughout both runs of a two run race.

**Scoreboard Keeper** - The Scoreboard Keeper will write each bib number and time of the finishing athletes on the posted scoreboard adjacent to the timing shack as they are communicated to him/her by the timing shack. This scoreboard is provided so that all racers can see their times in comparison to their peers. While it seems primitive, the majority of all ski and snowboard racing use a system like this, with more technological systems in place at premier events only (i.e. Olympics, World Cup, etc.).

**Newsletter Article Writer**

The host team is responsible for writing a newsletter article for the SCCSC News newsletter after the weekend is complete. The article should be about the team's experience during the race weekend, and should be no more than 350 words and no less than 150. The article should include a photo and caption. The newsletter is distributed to school administrators, therefore use of slang or illicit subject matter is forbidden. Please keep the article clean and concise.

**THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS**

Please feel free to stop any one of these individuals if you have any questions regarding the host team duties. All other race day information, rule violation questions, or complaints must be referred to your Coach or Captain. Racers, Team Officers, and Captains should never approach mountain personnel with complaints. The proper channels must be followed through the SCCSC Race Staff.

# Safety and Awareness

---

There is acute concern with skier and snowboarder safety, awareness, and education throughout the ski and snowboard industry in the United States. All skiers and snowboarders, including competitors in racing and training situations, are responsible for their own safety - and must be aware at all times of conditions affecting their own safety and the safety of others around them.

In addition, USCSA and the SCCSC encourage all racing programs, event organizers, coaches, officials, parents and racers to become more aware of safety in ski and snowboard competitions and training situations. The following guidelines are provided courtesy of the US Ski Coaches Association and the Mammoth Mountain Race Department.

## Racer Responsibility Code:

1. Bindings must be in good condition and properly adjusted for the conditions. Unbreakable goggles are essential. Racing helmets are required per SCCSC and USCSA rules in all events.
2. Snowboard leashes are required at all times. Use caution and care when removing your snowboard and/or leash on the race hill.
3. Warm up for training and racing sessions. Stretch for at least five minutes before skiing or boarding. Warm up gradually on snow, skiing and boarding various radius turns, before skiing at racing speed.
4. Always carefully inspect a course before running it. Follow the inspection rules for the training session or race. Do not cross or go onto closed courses at competitions, and always be certain that practice courses are clear before proceeding.
5. If you fall and are unhurt, immediately signal that you are OK and quickly move a safe distance away from the course. Collect your gear and reorganize away from the active course.
6. While attending a race event, stand far enough from the course to allow a racer on course full visibility, room to recover, and room to come to a stop without hitting you.
7. Always remain still while there is a racer on course, and never free ski or snowboard on or near a closed race course except as allowed by the established inspection procedures.
8. If a gate pole is knocked out or broken and presents a danger, place it outside the course, preferably totally to the side of the slope or as directed by the coaches.
9. Be sure to communicate with your captain when tired, ill uncertain or afraid, if the course is too difficult or rough, or if visibility is poor. It is your responsibility to communicate your concern to your captain and/or Mammoth Mt. Race Department, and possibly, to withdraw from the race or training session.
10. Always stop below your coach or training group - never attempt to stop above any skier or group. Always leave room to take "evasive action" should your coach or others in your training group move unexpectedly.
11. When your run is complete, move immediately out of the finish area or away from the course. Make sure that you have an adequate finish area and safe room outside all courses.
12. Never jump or ski or snowboard fast into an uncontrolled "blind spot."
13. When free-skiing outside specific, identified race and training areas you must be aware of others and ski in full control at all times. Respect other skiers' and snowboarders' rights to a safe and pleasant skiing experience.

# Racer Social Conduct – Alcohol Policy

---

Social activities are an important part of the life and atmosphere of the students enrolled in the member schools who participate in the Southern California Collegiate Snowsports Conference (SCCSC). It is recognized that these activities at times involve both the attendance of a substantial number of students under 21 years of age and the presence of alcoholic beverages. This SCCSC Student Alcohol Policy (hereinafter, the SAP) was developed with careful consideration to individual and community health and welfare issues as well as the realities of implementation.

The Policy is intended to apply to:

- A. Programs and events that are organized and sponsored by Registered Campus Organizations, at which attendance consists predominantly of students under 21 years of age and at which alcoholic beverages will be present.
- B. SCCSC-sponsored events at which attendance consists predominantly of students under 21 years of age and at which alcoholic beverages will be present.

The Policy is to be applied in conjunction with local, state, and federal laws, codes, and ordinances.

## **POLICY STATEMENT**

The SCCSC requires that individuals and groups choosing to offer alcoholic beverages at their programs and events operate within state and local laws and comply with responsible hosting guidelines, as outlined in this Policy.

In accordance with the SAP, alcoholic beverages may be present at events where attendance is likely to consist predominantly of students under 21 years of age only in regulated settings that give the highest priority to standards for student health, safety, and responsibility that apply across entire populations.

## **Standards for Student Health, Safety, and Responsibility:**

The following standards are designed to promote student health, safety, and responsibility. Subject to the facility use and scheduling policies and constraints of the venue involved, alcoholic beverages may be served at programs and events where attendance is likely to consist predominantly of students under 21 years of age only under the following general provisions and specific conditions:

- a. The service and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages is to be complementary to the event; under no circumstances should an event have the consumption of alcohol as its primary purpose.
- b. All events at which alcohol is served must also include the provision of alternate non-alcoholic beverages and free or reasonably priced snacks throughout the duration of the event. If alcoholic beverages are sold, alternate non-alcoholic beverages may be reasonably priced; if alcohol is served free of charge, the alternate non-alcoholic beverages must also be complimentary.
- c. No one under 21 years of age may be served, or possess, alcoholic beverages. Staff or bartenders must ask for proof of age.

- d. The event sponsor is responsible for ensuring that all activities at which alcohol is to be present are planned and conducted in a manner that assures compliance with this SAP as well as state and local laws.
- e. The event sponsor is responsible for ensuring that all activities at which alcohol is to be present are planned and conducted in a manner that minimizes any risk to the health and safety of attendees. Drinking contests or games are strictly prohibited.
- f. Programs and events at which alcohol is present and where attendance is likely to consist predominantly of students under 21 years of age shall not be open to the public. Attendance shall be by invitation to selected members of the campus community (and their guests) who can be readily identified by procedures or mechanisms typically used to determine membership in the campus community (e.g., University-Issued Student Identity Cards).
- g. No registered campus organization may co-sponsor or co-finance an event at which alcoholic beverages are purchased by any of the sponsoring organizations.
- h. The purchase of alcoholic beverages may not be coordinated by any one person on behalf of a registered campus organization.
- i. Promote advertising that integrates the message of social norms and harm reduction, and not those that encourage alcohol consumption.
- j. Promote the message of individual and group harm reduction, through the mandatory use and encouragement of designated drivers at all events when alcoholic beverages are served.

## **ALCOHOL-RELATED ADVERTISING**

Advertisements that reference alcoholic beverages, in any form (e.g., print ads, e-mail or website announcements, banners, signs, flyers, t-shirts, etc.), may not portray drinking as a means to academic or social success, associate alcohol with the performance of tasks that require skilled reactions such as the driving of an automobile, suggest that drinking is the sole purpose or dominant theme of an event, or promote alcohol consumption as an expectation during the event or activity.

Print advertisements that incorporate an alcoholic beverage trademark or logo must display the trademark/logo as clearly subordinate to the message concerning the event itself. The name of an alcoholic beverage manufacturer or distributor may not be connected to the name of the event itself, but may be listed as a sponsor of a specific event.

## **VIOLATION OF STUDENT ALCOHOL POLICY**

The SCCSC will provide education, assessment, counseling and referral services for students addressing alcohol-related issues.

Discipline may be imposed upon organizations or individual students in accordance with basic standards of procedural due process following the alleged violation of the Policy and the filing of written charges. Discipline will be determined on a case-by-case basis, but can include:

- Fines for Misconduct
- Individual/Team Points Disqualified from race or from season
- Removal of Individual(s) from SCCSC competition for race weekend
- Removal of Individual(s) from SCCSC competition for race season
- Permanent Removal of Individual(s) from SCCSC program
- Removal of Team(s) from SCCSC competition for race weekend
- Removal of Team(s) from SCCSC competition for race season

# Racer Duties and Responsibilities

---

- A. Get to the start area **BEFORE** your bib number is called.
- B. Understand and accept the inherent risks of the sport. Sign your release form.
- C. Display good sportsmanship; know and respect the rules.
- D. If you encounter problems or difficulties, always consult your team captains or the SCCSC Executive Committee. Do not address concerns directly with the Mammoth Mountain Race Department.
- E. You are responsible for your actions on the hill. Always ski or board in control. Use proper course inspection techniques.
- F. Bibs must be worn to compete. Bibs must be **FULLY** visible, **FASTENED** in place, and outside all warm-up clothing, from the time the course is set until the course is taken down. Failure to have bibs properly displayed during the race will result in a fine of \$20.
- G. The bib number **MUST** be the number assigned by the Executive Committee. Racers without proper bibs will be disqualified and will not be able to race that race. No writing of their number onto another racer's bib, this is grounds for disqualification. In the event of a lost bib, racer must go to registration area and purchase a new bib. Once a new bib has been purchased, the old bib will become obsolete.
- H. All racers must wear helmets which are in good physical condition to participate in each event sanctioned by the USCSA and SCCSC.
- I. Assist your team with mandatory hosting duties.
- J. Show proper courtesy to all race course personnel. Interfering with Mountain Personnel, Executive Committee, Gatekeepers, Starters, Finishers, or a racer on course will result in a \$25 fine.
- K. If you miss a gate, you must either hike back up the hill to the gate or ski off the course.
- L. Absolutely NO swearing, profanity, or obscene language will be permitted on the race course at ANY time. Failure to follow this responsibility will result in a \$10 fine for first offense, \$20 fine for second offense, and \$30 fine for third offense. Racer found swearing and assessed a fine may be disqualified for the days events, determined by the SCCSC Chief of Race on a case by case basis.
- M. Absolutely NO drinking of any type of alcoholic beverage will be permitted on the race course at ANY time, including beverages in cans, bottles, or any of type of container. Failure to follow this responsibility will result in a \$25 fine for first offense, \$50 fine for second offense, and removal from the SCCSC on the third offense. Any student found consuming alcohol in SCCSC attire (bib or other assigned, purchased, or provided trademarked uniform) or with alcohol at an SCCSC event will be disqualified automatically from the days events in addition to the fines mentioned.

- N. Teams running ineligible racers will result in team disqualification from the day's events of the discipline with ineligible racers participating. Ineligible racers includes switching bib numbers for a single race or day's events.
- O. Anyone associated with the SCCSC who tries to defraud the league, the mountain, or any other organization involved with our league will be fined \$100 and will be expelled from the SCCSC, and may be subject to legal liability (both criminal and civil).
- P. Persistent violation of the race rules by an individual racer or team, will result in either temporary or permanent disqualification of said racer or team.
- Q. The SCCSC is an extension of Intercollegiate Athletics and as such demands good sportsmanship from all participants. Racers found not acting as good sports may be disqualified or fined \$20 by SCCSC Race Officials. Racers accused of poor sportsmanship will be requested to explain and defend their actions prior to receiving disciplinary action. Poor sportsmanship includes, but is not limited to, throwing equipment, excessive cussing, disrespecting Race Officials, etc.
- R. No athlete may participate in race events if they have unpaid fines assessed in their or their team's name.

# Southern California Collegiate Snowsport Conference 2010-2011 Waiver & Release of Liability



## PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING. THIS IS A RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND WAIVER OF CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS

In consideration for the rights and privileges associated with competing in the Southern California Collegiate Ski and Snowboard Conference, Inc., (hereinafter referred to as "SCCSC"), the undersigned acknowledges and agrees to be bound by the following:

1. The undersigned, if over 18 years of age, has read and signed this Waiver and Release of Liability. If the undersigned is **UNDER** 18 years of age, then **IN ADDITION** to his/her signature, this Waiver and Release has been read and signed by his/her parent or legal guardian. (The undersigned is hereinafter referred to collectively as "Competitor")

2. Competitor accepts and understands that skiing and snowboarding in their various forms are **HAZARDOUS** sports that have many dangers and risks.

Competitor further understands that events tangential to skiing and snowboarding with the SCCSC, may also be hazardous, such as parties, banquets, commuting, attending meetings, and other dangers not specifically identified herein.

It is further understood that training, competing, or racing competitively is more **HAZARDOUS** than recreational activities. Additionally, Competitor acknowledges that there are attendant dangers in commuting to events, event social functions, meetings, and other dangers not necessarily specifically identified herein. Competitor realizes that injuries are a common and ordinary occurrence of this sport, or in the events tangential to this sport. Competitor agrees as a condition of being allowed participation in any skiing or snowboarding activity, including but not limited to, preparation for participation in, coaching, and related activities in alpine, nordic, freestyle, and snowboarding competitions and clinics, or in the course of travel to or from any such event, attending meetings, attending social functions (such as parties and banquets), (hereinafter "Activity"), involves risks of serious injury, including permanent disability, death and other losses, both to Competitor and his/her property. Competitor understands that these injuries and losses might result not only from his/her actions, but the actions, inactions, or negligence of others. Competitor hereby assumes all risks which may be associated with and/or result from his/her involvement in such Activity and hereby holds **HARMLESS, RELEASES, INDEMNIFIES, AND DEFENDS**, the SCCSC, USCSA, its subsidiaries and affiliates, their respective Executive Committee members, officers, directors, agents, employees, coaches, trainers, doctors, officials, event organizers, the ski area, or sponsors (hereinafter "SCCSC"), of and from any liability, claims, demands, actions, and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage or injury, including death, that may be sustained by Competitor while participating in the Activity, including, but not limited to, those injuries and damages caused by the negligence and/or breach of warranty, expressed or implied, on the part of the SCCSC.

Competitor covenants not to sue SCCSC, its Executive Committee members, officers, directors, agents, employees, coaches, trainers, doctors, officials, event organizers, the ski area, or sponsors for any injury befalling him/her from any Activity.

4. By execution of this release Competitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the SCCSC for claims or demands from any injury to Competitor or other person(s) or property which may arise as a result of Competitor engaging in Activity.

5. Competitor authorizes SCCSC (as previously defined in paragraph 3), Mammoth Mt. Ski Area, and/or its authorized personnel to call for medical care for him/her or to transport him/her to a medical facility or hospital if, in the opinion of such personnel, medical attention is needed for him/her. SCCSC is not required to do so, and, in its discretion, may choose not to. In the event SCCSC does summon or transport Competitor to a medical facility or hospital, Competitor agrees that upon his/her transport to any such medical facility or hospital that SCCSC shall not have further responsibility for him/her. Competitor further understands that SCCSC will not provide or advance funds for medical care. 7. **IN THE EVENT ANY SECTION OF THIS RELEASE IS FOUND TO BE UNENFORCEABLE, THE REMAINING TERMS SHALL BE FULLY ENFORCEABLE.**

8. **THIS RELEASE SHALL BE BINDING TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW.**

9. This release shall be binding upon Competitor's assignees, subrogors, distributees, heirs, next-of-kin, executors, personal representatives, and administrators and may be pled by the SCCSC as a complete bar and defense against any claim, demand, action or causes of action by or on behalf of the Competitor.

10. I currently have, and I agree to maintain throughout the time that I train and compete, valid and sufficient medical and accident insurance. I understand that this is my sole responsibility and release all persons and entities identified above from providing this coverage for me.
